- 2. I am a Major in the United States Air Force. I have known Major Margaret Witt for approximately 7 years. I first met Major Witt when she joined the 446th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron ("446th").
- 3. I was on active duty in the U.S. Air Force from May 1979 to January 1984 and have been stationed in Charleston, South Carolina and in Germany. On July 4, 1987, I joined the U.S. Air Force Reserves and have been a member of the 446th for 19 years. I am stationed at McChord Air Force Base in Tacoma, Washington. I am the Chief of Standards and Evaluations and my duties include ensuring that all members of the 446th are current in their training requirements and that they are properly and timely evaluated.
- 4. In the performance of my duties, I regularly worked with Major Witt. We worked together in a number of ways. For example, we worked to prepare and present required trainings to members of the 446th.
- 5. I have always known Major Witt to be highly professional, skilled and disciplined. I have the utmost trust and confidence in her abilities as a member of the U.S. Air Force and was honored to serve with her as a member of the 446th.
- 6. I believe that Major Witt is a highly valuable, well-liked and well-respected member of our Unit. She also plays an important role in ensuring the good order, morale and cohesion of our Unit. I have always found that Major Witt has a calming effect on people and that this quality helps others with whom she works perform their duties effectively, efficiently and to the best of their abilities.

- 7. Based on my personal observations of Major Witt I can say with confidence that her presence in the Air Force greatly enhances her Unit's combat efficiency and readiness. In short, Major Witt knows and performs her job well.
- 8. I have routinely witnessed Major Witt interact with her superiors, subordinates and peers. I believe that Major Witt sustains strong working relationships with and has the respect of all of the members of the 446th, regardless of rank. In my experience, Major Witt performed her supervisory duties successfully and professionally. Major Witt's strong relationships helped maintain an effective chain of command in our Unit.
- 9. I have shared confined quarters, such as showers and toilet facilities that allowed for minimal privacy with Major Witt. At no time did I feel uncomfortable with Major Witt's presence in these confined quarters or feel that my privacy was, in any way, impinged.
- 10. I do not believe that Major Witt's presence in the U.S. Air Force or, specifically, in our Unit would jeopardize recruiting efforts. In fact, I understand that Major Witt was selected to appear on various U.S. Air Force recruiting posters, brochures and other materials because she exemplified the qualities that the U.S. Air Force sought in recruits. I have seen these recruiting posters, featuring Major Witt, on more than one occasion and as recently as May of 2004 when I attended a U.S. Air Force conference in Orlando, Florida. I also personally believe that Major Witt exemplifies the qualities that makes one a good and valuable member of the U.S. Air Force.

In all the time that I have known Major Witt and served with her, I have 11. never seen or heard of anyone in the armed forces expressing any problem with her. I have never heard anyone complain about her. I have never heard anyone say that they wished she was not a member of their unit. I have never heard of any incident where she caused a discipline or morale problem.

- In approximately October of 2004, Major Witt told me that she is being 12. discharged because of allegations that she is homosexual. Although Major Witt has never told me that she is homosexual, I have long assumed that she was a lesbian. Assuming she is a lesbian, I can say without reservation that this fact makes absolutely no difference to me. In my opinion, if command were to announce that Major Witt was lesbian and that she was remaining in the service, her continued presence in the Air Force would not have any negative impact upon our unit's morale, discipline, or combat readiness, and no negative impact whatsoever upon me and my desire to continue to work with her.
- 13. In sum, I firmly believe that discharging Major Witt from the U.S. Air Force would be detrimental. Moreover, I believe that our Unit's morale, cohesion and good order would be severely jeopardized if Major Witt is discharged.
