- 3. I have been a member of the U.S. Air Force Reserves for 18 years and am stationed at McChord Air Force Base in Tacoma, Washington. My title is Chief of Standards and Evaluations for the 446 Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron ("446<sup>th</sup>). I am also a Flight Nurse for the 446<sup>th</sup>. As part of my duties, I fly into Combat Air Support Hospitals and attend to wounded soldiers while they are being transported out to other medical facilities. I also am responsible for managing the evaluations and testing of other Flight Nurses and Technicians in the 446<sup>th</sup>.
- 4. In the performance of my duties, I regularly worked with Major Witt. In fact, I was Major Witt's assistant for a period of time and we worked together constantly. We worked together in a number of ways, including evaluating and testing other Flight Nurses and Technicians. Through my work with her, I have come to know Major Witt very well.
- 5. I have always known Major Witt to be highly professional, skilled and disciplined. I have the utmost trust and confidence in her abilities as a member of the U.S. Air Force and am honored to serve with her as a member of the 446th.
- 6. I believe that Major Witt is a highly valuable, well-liked and well-respected member of our squadron. She also plays an important role in ensuring the good order, morale and cohesion of the 446th. For example, Major Witt is a great leader and communicator. She makes sure that all tasks are properly completed without micro-managing others and is on top of every aspect of her work.
- 7. Based on my personal observations of Major Witt I can say with confidence that her presence in the U.S. Air Force greatly enhances our squadron's combat efficiency and readiness because she is an excellent flight nurse.

- 8. I have routinely witnessed Major Witt interact with her superiors, subordinates and peers. I believe that Major Witt sustains strong working relationships with and has the respect of all of the members of our squadron, regardless of rank. In my experience, Major Witt performs her supervisory duties successfully and professionally. Major Witt's strong relationships help maintain an effective chain of command in our squadron.
- 9. I have not served in active duty with Major Witt, but based upon my experience with her, I would have absolutely no hesitation in doing so. In fact, I would welcome the opportunity to serve with Major Witt and would fly with her at any time under any circumstances
- 10. I have not shared confined sleeping and dressing areas, showers or toilet facilities with Major Witt in barracks that allowed for minimal privacy. However, I am completely comfortable in doing so and would not feel that my privacy would, in any way, be impinged by sharing these confined quarters with Major Witt.
- In I do not believe that Major Witt's presence in the U.S. Air Force or, specifically, in the 446th would jeopardize recruiting efforts. In fact, when I was at Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomery, Alabama I saw numerous U.S. Air Force recruiting posters on which Major Witt was selected to appear. I believe that the U.S. Air Force chose Major Witt to appear on these recruiting posters because she exemplifies the qualities that the U.S. Air Force seeks in recruits. I also personally believe that Major Witt exemplifies the qualities that makes one a good and valuable member of the U.S. Air Force.
- 12. In all the time that I have known Major Witt and served with her, I have never seen or heard of anyone in the armed forces expressing any problem with her. I have never

heard anyone complain about her. I have never heard anyone say that they wished she was not a member of their squadron. I have never heard of any incident where she caused a discipline or morale problem. To the contrary, everyone I know loves Major Witt and highly values her as a member of the 446<sup>th</sup>.

In approximately November of 2004, Col. Moore-Harbert told me that I was 13. the "new Chief of Standards and Evaluations" because Major Witt was "no longer there." However, I have never been directly told why Major Witt is being discharged. Regardless, I suspect that Major Witt is being discharged because she is accused of being a lesbian. Although she has never said a word to me about her sexual orientation or sexual conduct, I have long assumed that Major Witt was a lesbian. Assuming that she is a lesbian, I can say without reservation that this fact makes absolutely no difference to me. In my opinion, if command were to announce to everyone on base that Major Witt was lesbian and that she was remaining in the service, her continued presence in the Air Force would not have any negative impact upon our squadron's morale, discipline, or combat readiness, and no negative impact whatsoever upon me personally. It would still be my strong desire to have her remain in the service and to continue to work with her.

In sum, I firmly believe that discharging Major Witt from the U.S. Air Force would be detrimental. Moreover, I believe that our squadron's morale, cohesion and good order have already been damaged because Major Witt has been prohibited from participating with the 446<sup>th</sup> for the past year and would be severely jeopardized if Major Witt is discharged.
