The court previously struck Plaintiff's response and ordered Plaintiff to comply with 16 17 Rule 7(e)(3) (Dkt. 96) and denied a subsequent motion for leave to file an overlength response of 185 pages. Dkt. 102. That denial was affirmed by the district court. Dkt. 108. In his most 18 19 recent motion, Mr. Curtis represents that he has endeavored to reduce his response and has managed to reduce it by over half of its original length and that further reduction would result 20 21 in abandonment of some of his claims. 22 Accordingly, it is **ORDERED**: 23 1. Plaintiff's motion for leave to file a response brief of an additional 96 pages (Dkt. 109) is **GRANTED.** 24 25 26
