STIPULATION REGARDING NON-WAIVER OF PRIVILEGE PURSUANT TO FEDERAL RULE OF EVIDENCE 502(d)

To avoid burdening the Court with a discovery dispute, the parties, through the undersigned counsel, respectfully request that the Court enter an order under Federal Rule of Evidence 502(d) to govern the production of certain communications between Plaintiffs Eagle Harbor Holdings, LLC, MediusTech, LLC and any predecessor companies, including Medius, Inc.
