Richard Creatura. The Court's authority for the referral is 28 U.S.C. § 17 636(b)(1)(A) and (B), and Magistrate Judge Rules MJR3 and MJR4. 18 Plaintiff filed two motions asking the Court to issue a protective order that would prevent 19 defendants from deposing him (ECF Nos. 52 and 53). Plaintiff alleges that the prison has not 20 granted him time in the prison law library to prepare for a deposition. He also alleges that he has 21 not been given 14-day notice of the deposition as required by Fed. R. Civ. P. 32(a)(5)(A) (ECF 22 No. 52, p.1). 23 24

The Court grants plaintiff's motions. Defendants must give plaintiff at least 14 days notice if they wish to use a deposition against a person. See, Fed. R. Civ. P. 32(a)(5)(A). Because the deposition is scheduled for September 19, 2013, the Court will not wait to rule on these motions until the noting date of October 4, 2013.
