15	of the Honorable J. Richard Creatura, United States Magistrate Judge (Dkt. 10), and	
16	Plaintiff Collins Sylvester Williams, Jr.'s ("Williams") objections to the R&R (Dkt. 11).	
17	On July 15, 2014, Williams filed a motion to proceed <i>in forma pauperis</i> and a	
18	proposed complaint. Dkt. 1. On August 8, 2014, Judge Creatura sua sponte reviewed the	
19	complaint, identified deficiencies in the complaint, and ordered Williams to file a new	
20	complaint. Dkt. 7. On August 19, 2014, Williams filed an amended complaint. Dkt. 8.	
20	On September 8, 2014, Judge Creatura issued the R&R recommending that the Court	
21		

dismiss the amended complaint because Williams failed to state a claim. Dkt. 10. On
 September 16, 2014, Williams filed objections. Dkt. 11.

The district judge must determine de novo any part of the magistrate judge's
disposition that has been properly objected to. The district judge may accept, reject, or
modify the recommended disposition; receive further evidence; or return the matter to the
magistrate judge with instructions. Fed. R. Civ. P. 72(b)(3).

In this case, Williams has failed to correct the identified deficiencies in his
complaint with either his amended complaint or his objections. Judge Creatura
specifically informed Williams that, in order to state a claim against Defendant Thurston
County, Williams must identify a specific policy that led to the deprivation of his
constitutional rights. Dkts. 7 & 10. Williams has failed to identify any applicable policy.
Therefore, the Court having considered the R&R, Williams's objections, and the
remaining record, does hereby find and order as follows:
