
Where, as here, a request for dismissal is made after defendants have answered or brought dispositive motions, “an action may be dismissed at the plaintiff’s request only by court order, on terms that the court considers proper.” Fed. R. Civ. P. 41 (a). Defendants do not oppose plaintiff’s motion, and do not seek any terms. Dkt. 83. Accordingly, the Court

ORDERS as follows:

- (1) Plaintiff’s motion for voluntary dismissal (Dkt. 82) is **GRANTED**; and
- (2) This matter is **DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE**.
