Having considered Plaintiff San Juan Construction, Inc.’s Motion for Judgment Debtor Examination of a Corporate Designee of Upper Hudson National Insurance Group, and the Declaration of John C. Theiss and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a Corporate Designee of Judgment Debtor/Defendant Upper Hudson National Insurance Group appear in Courtroom F at the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington, located at 1717 Pacific Avenue, Tacoma, Washington, on the **6th day of March, 2015, at 10:00 a.m.** to be sworn in for a Judgment Debtor Examination.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a Corporate Designee of Defendant/Judgment Debtor Upper Hudson National Insurance Group, appear in Courtroom F at the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington, located at 1717 Pacific Avenue, Tacoma, Washington, on the **6th day of March, 2015, at 10:00 a.m.** and answer concerning property subject to the ownership and control of Upper Hudson National Insurance Group.

1 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Corporate Designee of Upper Hudson National
2 Insurance Group bring with him the following documents under his control or under the control
3 of his agents, attorneys, or accountants:

4 1. All financial statements prepared for or on behalf of Judgment Debtor within the
5 past four years. This includes, but is not limited to, all balance sheets, income statements,
6 statements of profit and loss, and statements of cash flow.

7 2. All financial statements for any business owned, wholly or partially, by
8 Judgment Debtor in the past four years. This includes, but is not limited to, all balance sheets,
9 income statements, statements of profit and loss, and statements of cash flow.

10 3. All records of accounts receivable, notes receivable, contracts, or indebtedness
11 owed to Judgment Debtor.

12 4. All records of stocks, bonds, securities, notes, contracts, bank accounts, or
13 brokerage accounts in which Judgment Debtor has an interest. Judgment Debtor will produce
14 records of bonds and indemnity agreements in which (1) Upper Hudson has actually outlaid
15 expenses or losses, and for which it can pursue reimbursement at this time or (2) Upper
16 Hudson has not yet had any expenses or losses but where it does have actual notice of a claim.

17 5. All records of any items which Judgment Debtor has pledged as security for a
18 debt or in which Judgment Debtor has an interest.

19 6. All records of any legal claims in which Judgment Debtor has an interest.

20 7. All records of any rights, benefits, or options Judgment Debtor owns in any
21 property, real or personal.

22 8. Records of all intellectual property Judgment Debtor owns, including, but not
23 limited to, patents, trademarks, and copyrights.

24 9. Records of all personal property Judgment Debtor owns worth in excess of
25 \$1,000 (collectively for any category), including, but not limited to, equipment, inventory,
26 machinery, tools, art, furnishings, carpets, recreational equipment, electronic equipment, boats,
27 motor vehicles, aircraft, jewelry, and collectives. This includes, but is not limited to, records

1 (including title and registration documents) related to: recreational equipment, boats, and motor
2 vehicles.

3 10. All records of any transfer of anything of value that Judgment Debtor has made
4 to any affiliate or associate, including but not limited to, officers, directors, shareholders, or
5 family members in the past four years.

6 11. All records of any trust Judgment Debtor has created for the benefit of another
7 in the past four years.

8 12. All records of any savings or checking account, certificates of deposit, postal
9 savings accounts, safe-deposit boxes, or brokerage accounts that Judgment Debtor maintains at
10 any financial institution, wherever located.

11 13. All records of any annuities of which Judgment Debtor is a beneficiary.

12 14. All records of any life insurance policies of which Judgment Debtor is the
13 owner.

14 15. All records evidencing an ownership interest by Judgment Debtor in any
15 business, venture, or enterprise during the past five years, including but not limited to sole
16 proprietorships, corporations, and partnerships.

17 16. Any records of all real property, including any vendee's interest in real property
18 that Judgment Debtor owns.

19 17. All records of Judgment Debtor's rental income from any real estate it owns.

20 18. All records of Judgment Debtor's rental income from any real estate it leases.

21 19. All of Judgment Debtor's income tax returns filed in the past three years.
