


1 the Court that, though his direct appeal has terminated, he is still seeking review of the new
2 judgment and sentence by filing a personal restraint petition. *See* Dkt. 28.

3 In accordance with the Court's order, petitioner filed a status update on May 8, 2018,
4 explaining that his personal restraint petition was still pending. Dkt. 33. However, he filed a
5 second status update on June 21, 2018, explaining that he "already tried to file a continu[a]nce
6 but was never informed as to whether it was accepted or not." Dkt. 34. Therefore, the Court
7 clarifies its initial order staying the case as follows:

- 8 1) This matter continues to be stayed until 30 days after the Washington state court has
9 ruled on petitioner's challenge to his judgment and sentence.
- 10 2) Petitioner shall continue to file a status report every 90 days. Petitioner's report must
11 include the state court cause number and current status of his state proceedings.
12 Petitioner's failure to file a proper report may result in the Court issuing a report and
13 recommendation that this petition be dismissed for failure to comply with a Court
14 order.
- 15 3) The Court will acknowledge petitioner's status updates and will inform petitioner of
16 his next deadline.
- 17 4) Within 30 days of the Washington court's ruling on petitioner's challenge to his
18 judgment and sentence, either party may file a motion to lift the stay.
- 19 5) The Clerk is directed to note a due date on the Court's calendar 90 days from the
20 entry of this order and strike the June 1, 2018 deadline.
