Dkt. 1. In his IFP 16 17 motion, plaintiff states that he has \$15,600 from a civil lawsuit, \$148 in cash on hand, \$1600.00 18 in his checking account, and \$9,000 in his savings account. *Id.* Plaintiff also states that he uses 19 the money he received from the civil lawsuit to help support his mother. *Id.* Plaintiff's Prison 20 Trust Account Statement shows that plaintiff has average monthly receipts of \$364.07. Dkt. 2. 21 Based on the information supplied to the Court, plaintiff can afford the \$400.00 filing fee. 22 Therefore, plaintiff is ordered to show cause why his motion to proceed IFP should not be 23 24

denied. Plaintiff must respond to this order to show cause on or before June 3, 2016. In the alternative, plaintiff may pay the \$400.00 filing fee before that date. Failure to show cause or pay the amount shall be deemed a failure to properly prosecute this matter and the Court will recommend dismissal of this matter. Dated this 2nd day of May, 2016. J.
