## MEMORANDUM OPINION AND ORDER

By Standing Order, this action was referred to United States Magistrate R. Clarke VanDervort for submission of findings and recommendation regarding disposition pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B). Magistrate Judge VanDervort submitted to the court his Findings and Recommendation on December 9, 2013, in which he recommended that the court deny plaintiff's motion for judgment on the pleadings, grant defendant's motion for judgment on the pleadings, affirm the final decision of the Commissioner, and dismiss this matter from the court's docket.

In accordance with the provisions of 28 U.S.C. §
636(b), plaintiff was allotted fourteen days and three mailing days in which to file any objections to Magistrate Judge
VanDervort's Findings and Recommendation. The failure of any party to file such objections within the time allowed

constitutes a waiver of such party's right to a <u>de novo</u> review by this court. <u>Snyder v. Ridenour</u>, 889 F.2d 1363 (4th Cir. 1989).

Neither party filed any objections to the Magistrate

Judge's Findings and Recommendations within the required time

period. Accordingly, the court adopts the Findings and

Recommendations of Magistrate Judge VanDervort as follows:

- Plaintiff's motion for judgment on the pleadings
   is DENIED;
- 2. Defendant's motion for judgment on the pleadings is GRANTED;
- 3. The final decision of the Commissioner is AFFIRMED; and
- 4. This case is **DISMISSED** from the court's docket.

The Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this Memorandum Opinion and Order to counsel of record.
