MEMORANDUM OPINION AND ORDER

This action was previously referred to Mary E. Stanley, United States Magistrate Judge, who has submitted her Proposed Findings and Recommendation (PF&R") pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B).

The court has reviewed the Proposed Findings and Recommendation entered by the magistrate judge on October 19, 2010. The magistrate judge recommends dismissal of plaintiff's complaint for, <u>inter alia</u>, failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted. The plaintiff has not objected to the PF&R. Following a <u>de novo</u> review, the court concludes that the recommended disposition is correct.
