the court's docket; and no objection having been filed to the Proposed Findings and Recommendation, it is ORDERED that:

- The findings made in the Proposed Findings and Recommendation of the magistrate judge be, and they hereby are, adopted by the court and incorporated herein;
- 2. Plaintiff's request for a remand be, and it hereby
  is, granted;
- 3. Defendant's request to affirm the decision of the Commissioner be, and it hereby is, denied;
- 4. The decision of the Commissioner be, and it hereby is, reversed;
- 5. This action be, and it hereby is, remanded pursuant to sentence four of 42 U.S.C. § 405(g), for further proceedings which shall include consideration of Dr. Robert McCleary's opinions and Dr. McCleary's and David Summers' treatment of plaintiff, and as more fully set forth in the magistrate judge's Proposed Findings and Recommendation.

The Clerk is directed to forward copies of this written opinion and order to all counsel of record and the United States Magistrate Judge.
