2. Petitioner be, and he hereby is, granted a stay so that

he may pursue his state court remedies for his unexhausted claims

and that the stay be, and hereby is, conditioned on Petitioner

pursuing his state court remedies within thirty (30) days of the date

of this order;

3. Petitioner's habeas petition be, and it hereby is, held

in abeyance pending exhaustion of his state court remedies, and

Petitioner be, and hereby is, required to return to federal court

within thirty (30) days after he has exhausted his state court

remedies and seek to lift the stay; and

4. Respondent's motion to dismiss (ECF Doc. No. 9) be, and

it hereby is, denied without prejudice.

In view of the stay, it is ORDERED that this case be removed

from the active docket of the court.

opinion and order to plaintiff, all counsel of record and the United

States Magistrate Judge.
