An employee of your library gave me your name  
as the appropriate person to write a letter of concern  
to. (convoluted English I know)

As I came to the library today to ask a  
reference librarian about the meaning of the word

this summer, to read 2 newspapers - (or more) the MJS  
and the MADISON paper and to start to write a  
supplement to hand in to the Federal Court - US District  
Court for Western Wisconsin - on Tuesday 7/5/2011 when  
they open at 8am.

I arrived at about 12:45 pm and was told  
by 2 nice gentlemen on duty at the entrance to  
go to the 2nd floor for reference help. A nice lady  
working there showed me where the Webster  
dictionary was and said a reference librarian  
would be on duty at 1 pm. I went to read the MJS  
and MADISON paper Capitol Journal (?) and at  
1:40 pm returned to the Reference Desk on the 2nd  
floor. No one was there. In the periodical  
room everyone was using computers if I remember  
correctly about 5 men + 1 woman. No one was reading.  
I became disturbed. Even more so when no one was  
at the reference desk. I believe I was told there  
is 1 security person on duty all weekend +

That your library is open until 5:45 pm today & closed tomorrow. No one seems to have id on. So I draw your attention to:

- ① Lack of reference staff
- ② Lack of security staff
- ③ Possible improper use of your computers & personal computers
- ④ Possible theft of materials including rare materials
- ⑤ Possible staying in the library tonight & Monday after the library is closed.

Frankly I find the situation at UW-MADISON in so many ways deplorable. UW-MADISON's Memorial Library used to be a Gem & the heart of the University - at least Humanities. I fear for what is going on - lack of educated librarians with the ability to find material without the use of a computer. And physically you are being assaulted by this constant construction in the area between you & the State Historical Society & at the Union.

Sir, A long time ago I was at Georgetown University in Washington D.C. We had <sup>an</sup> international student body, as it appears you do now, & last Summer, but Georgetown U had control of its buildings and RIGGS Library. Librarians were at least Mastered degree and I believe held to high accountability. Mr. Sam Waters assistant librarian there cared about the library, its acquisitions, and his colleagues and staff. People talked to one another. There was at least for staff and students a minimal dress code and behavior code. Yes this was a private Catholic university which then was not known for being a high ranked

or known for its wonderful mens athletic programs and teams.

There was a <sup>mens</sup> tennis team and a <sup>mens</sup> basketball team. But there was a stress on trying to learn to gain high positions after graduation and some tradition of service to others.

I don't know quite where to start or end. The destruction of this university - UW-MADISON seems just to continue on. Why? who are these half-naked people in sports clothes running around UW-MADISON and State Street?

I don't know what to suggest! I would rather you tighten access + hours with even more than necessary, ethical trained honest staff on duty than continue letting this great collection be open to rip offs and more destruction.

I am again going to raise the question which is in my mind - was the death of the UW-Memorial female employee long on the staff there - accidental or deliberate? Strange violent things are happening -

That death, the fire last week burning for 8 hours next to the YWCA on Capitol here, near the Capitol, a death at the MCHC in Milwaukee on 6/30/2011 now being investigated etc.

Please do what you can to solve these problems. as I walked down Lake St from the library to the Alumni Center I saw a red trailer marked The Avenger. Why would one name a trailer that?

PS- Did you have a Memorial Service for the women on staff here killed recently?

## COMMUNITY BORROWERS CARD (ANNUAL FEE)

Adult residents of Wisconsin are eligible to borrow books from the UW—Madison General Library System. Two forms of identification, plus a \$30.00 annual fee (\$15.00 for citizens over age 62) must be presented to the Card Application Desk. One form of ID must have a recognizable photo, both forms must have current address information, showing Wisconsin residency. Checks, credit or debit cards will be accepted at the Card Application Desk for payment of the annual fee.

The borrowing card is issued on a fiscal year basis and expires each June 30. Cards may be renewed annually by again presenting ID showing current Wisconsin residency, provided that there are no outstanding replacement or processing fees. All such charges must be paid before the card is renewed.

## CIRCULATION POLICIES

A currently valid Memorial Library card must be presented at the time of checking out or renewing library materials.

The borrower is responsible for all books checked out on his or her borrowing card. The borrowing card is not transferable. Report the loss of your card immediately to the Memorial Library Card Application Desk.

PLEASE NOTE THAT EACH CAMPUS LIBRARY HAS ITS OWN CIRCULATION POLICIES AND LOAN PERIODS. INFORMATION ON THESE POLICIES IS AVAILABLE AT THE INDIVIDUAL LIBRARIES.

Patrons are responsible for knowing these various policies and the loan periods for the items they check out. Patrons may return books to any campus library where the "OPEN RETURN" logo is displayed. Exceptions to this policy are: reserve items, journals/periodicals, audiovisual materials, and items with loan periods of seven days or less. These items must be returned to the library from which they were borrowed.

## LOAN PERIODS

If you wish to obtain a date due receipt for a book, please request one from the circulation staff before the book is borrowed. Otherwise all due date information is available on-line from your MadCat account. These due dates are subject to change if the items are recalled.

## RENEWALS

Renewals may be done using one of the following methods:

1. Through MadCat: Patrons may renew items by clicking on the words "My MadCat Account" on the MadCat screen (<http://madcat.library.wisc.edu/>). Entering an ID number and the last name will bring up a list of the items currently charged out to the patron. By clicking on the white box next to each item, the material may be renewed. In some cases, the item may not be renewed. Therefore, it is important to make sure that the screen says, "renewed" in the far right-hand column.
2. In person: patron must have the original charge receipt for the item(s). These receipts and the patron's ID card can be presented at any campus library Circulation Desk.
3. By phone: the renewal number is 265-9019 and is available Monday-Friday from 8:00am-4:00pm. Patrons must be prepared to give their 11-digit patron ID number and the item numbers of the books to be renewed.

NOTE: ANYONE WISHING TO KEEP CHECKED OUT MATERIALS IN LIBRARY CARREL/LOCKER MUST HAVE RECEIPTS IN THE BACK OF THE BOOK(S).

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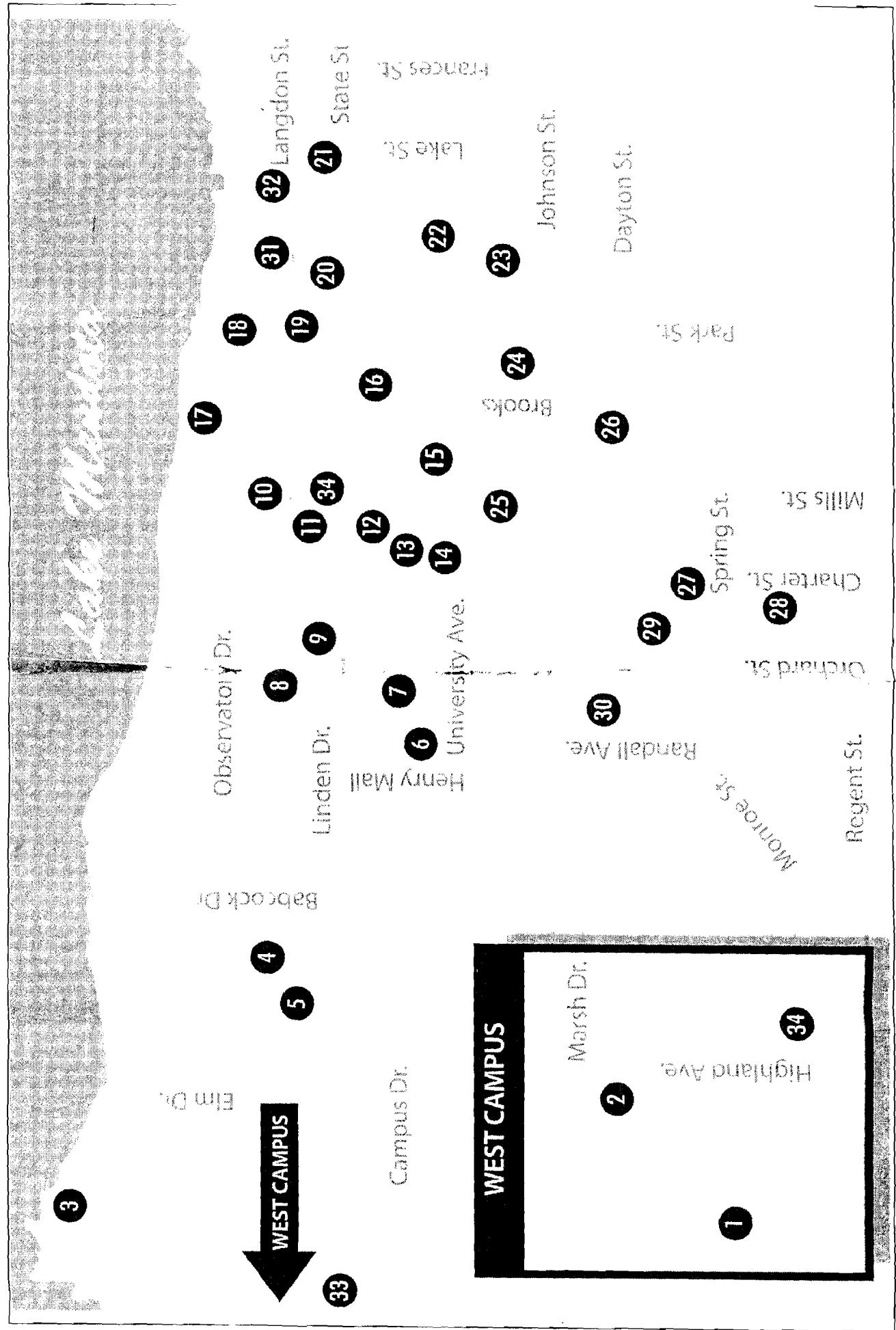

MILWAUKEE COUNTY RESIDENTS ON MEDICAL ASSISTANCE/BADGERCARE  
AND

**PLEASE READ THIS IMPORTANT NOTICE**

In July, 2008, several Milwaukee County residents filed a lawsuit called West v. Timberlake (Case No. 08-cv-0670) (now called "West v. Smith"). West v. Smith is a class action in the federal court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin. The federal court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin has directed that this notice be sent. This notice tells you about this case. Please read it carefully.

**What is a class action?** A class action is a lawsuit filed by a person or persons on behalf of other people who have the same complaints. The persons who filed West v. Timberlake are residents of Milwaukee County who were having problems getting Medical Assistance, BadgerCare or FoodShare. (FoodShare is also called Food Stamps.) The persons who filed this case are representatives of all people in Milwaukee County who have the same complaints.

**Who is in the class?** The class is defined as "all eligible applicants for, and recipients of, FoodShare, Medical Assistance (MA), and BadgerCare Plus who reside in Milwaukee County." The class does not include some applicants and recipients. The persons who are not included are: "MA recipients who also receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or foster care; and, applicants for, and recipients of, Katie Beckett MA, SeniorCare, BadgerCare Plus Core Plan for Childless Adults, Family Care, or a home and community-based waivers program under section 1915 of the Social Security Act."

**What problems did the class representatives complain about?** The lawsuit was filed because applications for MA, BadgerCare or FoodShare were not processed or open cases were closed for no review; verification documents were not processed; six-month report forms (Six Month Reviews) were not processed; and class members could not reach workers in the Milwaukee County Department of Human Services (Milwaukee County) to get problems with their cases corrected.

**What did the lawsuit ask for?** The lawsuit asked the Court to order Milwaukee County and the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (the State) to follow federal Medical Assistance and Food Stamp laws that require applications, reviews and Six Month Reviews to be processed within certain time limits.

**What happened after the lawsuit was filed?** The State and the attorney for the class signed an agreement in April, 2009. In that agreement, the State agreed to take a number of steps to improve application, review and verification processing in Milwaukee County. After the agreement was signed:

The State established a telephone call center staffed with over 60 people where questions about cases are answered.

The State reports that more than 90% of applications are decided within 30 days.

The State reports that more than 90% of reviews are decided in the review month or within 10 days.

The State reports that more than 90% of FoodShare Six Month Reviews are processed within 10 days.

The State reports that more than 90% of verification documents are processed within 10 days.

The State prepared new notices telling people about missing verification and explaining what verification is needed.

The defendants are not saying that they violated any requirements of federal or state law.

**Why are you receiving this notice now?** The State and the attorney for the persons who filed the lawsuit are now asking the federal court to dismiss this case. If the court dismisses the case, the case will be over. The attorney for the persons who filed the lawsuit will also sign a document releasing the defendants from any liability. This means that class members cannot sue the defendants for these same problems. As a member of the class, you can object to the plan to dismiss the lawsuit if you do not believe that it should be dismissed. You cannot ask to “opt-out” (not be included in the class).

**How does a class member object?** As a member of the class, you may file an objection. You need to explain your reasons for objecting in writing.

**What is the deadline to object?** All objection forms must be received by July 31, 2011. Send the completed form to:

**When will objections be heard?** The federal court has scheduled a hearing in this case on Thursday, September 8, 2011 at 9:30 a.m. in Room 425 of the Federal Courthouse, 517 East Wisconsin Avenue, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. At the hearing the court will hear from persons who have filed objections. If you object and cannot attend the hearing, you should explain this on the objection form. The court will decide if this case will be dismissed *after the hearing*. The court will also decide if the attorney representing the class will receive attorney's fees. Attorney's fees will be paid by the State and Milwaukee County and will not be more than \$100,000.

**What if you have questions about your Medical Assistance, BadgerCare or FoodShare case but not about the class action lawsuit?** If you are having problems with your individual Medical Assistance, BadgerCare or FoodShare case, you may contact the Milwaukee Enrollment Services Center. 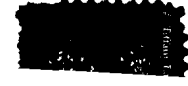

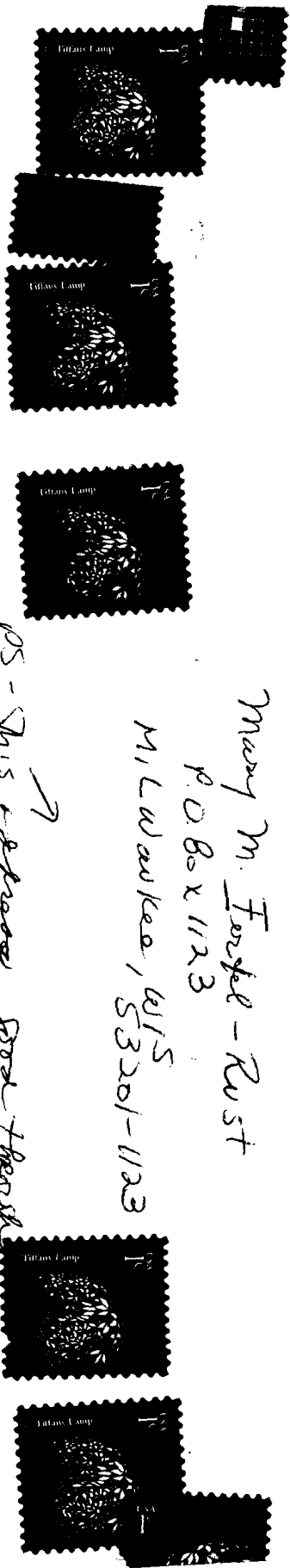
