DOCKETING STATEMENT

The district court's jurisdiction for adjudication of King's 28 U.S.C. §2241 Petition falls under that statute, 28 U.S.C. §2255(e), and 18 U.S.C. Chapter 211 §3231.


The court of appeals jurisdiction for review of an adverse district court final ruling is established under 28 U.S.C., Chapter 83, §1291. The district court's dismissal of the §2241 petition was entered on December 19, 2013. A timely motion for rehearing was denied on January 13, 2014.

Upon district court Case No. 13-cv-537-wmc, which is a 28 U.S.C. §2241 Petition, among the various issues raised was: (1) actual innocence to the federal charge as a nonexistent offense against King; (2) insufficient evidence as no evidence of frugs ever existed; and (3) an implicit showing of ineffective assistance of counsel. The district court would not address the merits of these issues in the §2241 petition, or the §2255 motion when

brought forward in that proceeding.
