Co., 62 So. 3d 1086, 1093 (Fla. 2010) (emphasizing that "certiorari cannot be used to grant a second appeal to correct the existence of mere legal error" and explaining that "a circuit court appellate decision made according to the forms of law and the rules prescribed for rendering it, although it may be erroneous in its conclusion as to what the law is as applied to facts, is not a departure from the essential requirements of law remediable by certiorari")(emphasis in original); State Farm Auto. Ins. Co. v. CC Chiropractic, LLC,
