PER CURIAM.

Rickey Smith challenges the trial court's order summarily denying his motion filed pursuant to Florida Rule of Criminal Procedure 3.850. We affirm.

In his motion, Smith alleged that his plea was involuntary because defense counsel affirmatively misadvised him regarding the future sentencingenhancing effects of the plea in regard to an as yet uncommitted crime. In <u>Stansel v.</u>

<u>State</u>, 27 Fla. L. Weekly D1947 (Fla. 2d DCA Aug. 28, 2002), we held that this claim is not cognizable in a rule 3.850 motion. We certify the same question that we certified in <u>Stansel</u>. We affirm, without discussion, any other issues raised by Smith in his motion.
