WHATLEY, Judge.

The State of Florida filed this petition for writ of certiorari seeking review of a circuit court order granting Carter's motion to disclose the identity of a confidential informant. Carter correctly concedes that the circuit court departed from the essential requirements of the law in ordering disclosure of the Cl's identity, because he did not

meet the dictates of <u>State v. Borrego</u>, 970 So. 2d 465 (Fla. 2d DCA 2007).<sup>1</sup>
Accordingly, we grant the State's petition for writ of certiorari and quash the order compelling disclosure.

Petition granted.
