Upon consideration of the record and publicly reported events, it appears Defendant-Appellee Lepo Taliese Utu is deceased, the issues posed by Plaintiff-Appellant State of Hawaii's appeal are mooted, and this court could not provide any remedy to the State if it were to prevail in the appeal. Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Plaintiff-Appellant State of Hawai'i shall,... show cause as to why this appeal should not be dismissed.
