ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

Upon consideration of appellee's motion to dismiss appeal, the papers in support and the record, it appears that the circuit court's May 28, 2004 decision was not reduced to a separate judgment pursuant to HRCP 58 by the time the record was filed in the supreme court on October 1, 2004.
