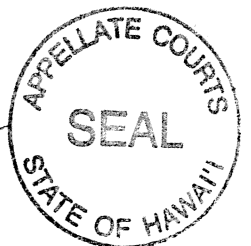
IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the appeal is dismissed.
