Upon consideration of the September 10, 2022 submission by the Office of Disciplinary Counsel (ODC) and the September 12, 2022 submission by the Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection (the Fund), filed under seal pursuant to Rules 2.22(a) and 10.8(a) of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i (RSCH), respectively, the August 3, 2022 letter from the Petitioner, and the record in this matter, we find no abuse of discretion in the deliberations of either ODC or the Fund (see In re Disciplinary Board of Hawai'i Supreme Court, 91 Hawai'i 363, 370, 984 P.2d 688, 695 (1999)), find the record
