CARTER, C.J.

Petitioner/Appellant, DeShawn Branch, an incarcerated prisoner, appeals the district court judgment, dismissing his petition for judicial review and affirming the Louisiana Parole Board action revoking his parole.

Following a final revocation hearing, Branch's parole was revoked for having absconded parole supervision. For the reasons fully set forth in the commissioner's report, we affirm the district court's dismissal of the petition by summary disposition in accordance with Uniform Rules-Louisiana Courts of Appeal, Rule 2-16.2A(5). Costs of this appeal are assessed to the petitioner/appellant, DeShawn Branch.
