WELCH, J., dissents. I would reverse the judgment of the trial court that disqualified Robert S. Reich from this case due to a conflict of interest. Mr. Robert S. Reich and the law firm of Reich, Album & Plunkett, L.L.C., represented defendant Allied Shipyard, Inc. for almost two years before Josh Jambon and Jambon Marine Service, L.L.C. joined in the litigation pursuant to a Fourth Amended Petition, thereby giving rise to the alleged conflict of interest. In support of their subsequent motion to recuse, the plaintiffs offered little evidence of the nature and scope of the purported outside representation provided by Mr. Reich and his law firm to Josh Jambon and/or Jambon Marine Service, LLC. Under the specific facts herein, and weighing the competing interests of the parties, the plaintiffs failed to sustain their burden of proving a conflict of interest under Rule 1.7(a) of the Louisiana Rules of Professional Conduct sufficient to warrant disqualification. Deprivation of Allied Shipyard, Inc. of its choice of counsel at this stage of the proceedings is unduly prejudicial.
