

WRIT NOT CONSIDERED. Relators have failed to comply with Uniform Rules of Louisiana Courts of Appeal, Rule 4-3, which provides that the writ application must be filed in the appellate court within the original or extended return date period set by the district court, and which further provides that an application not filed in the appellate court within the time so fixed or extended shall not be considered. According to Rule 4-3, the application shall contain documentation of the return date and any extensions thereof, and any application that does not contain this documentation may not be considered by the appellate court. Although the writ application is postmarked November 20, 2013, which is the return date set by the district court, relators failed to pay the filing fee to this Court on or before the return date of November 20, 2013 and, therefore, the filing of the writ application was incomplete on that date.

Supplementation of this writ application and/or an application for rehearing will not be considered. Rules 4-9 and 2-18.7, Uniform Rules of Louisiana Courts of Appeal. Any future filing on the issue presented in this writ application should include the entire contents of this application, documentation of an extended return date beyond the November 20, 2013 return date (if there is such an extended return date), and a copy of this ruling. In the event relator elects to file a new application with this Court, the application shall be filed on or before April 17, 2014.
