R.S. 15:1186.

Additionally, this application does not contain the affidavit and documents required by Rule 4-5, Uniform Rules of Louisiana Courts of Appeal. If relator intends to pursue this claim, he must (1) include the required documents regarding his inability to pay; and (2) provide a copy of the documents filed in the district court.

Any application filed in this Court should indicate what relief has been sought in the district court and the result of such filing. This Court is unable to process the application without the required documentation.

The writ application is being returned. In the event a new application is filed, please include all of the documents that are being returned to you.
