

WRIT DENIED. Relator's writ application is an untimely, repetitive, and successive application for postconviction relief. See La. Code Crim. P. arts. 930.4 & 930.8. Having fully litigated his claims in accord with La. Code Crim. P. art. 930.6, hereafter, unless he can show that one of the narrow exceptions authorizing the filing of a successive application provided in La. Code Crim. P. art. 930.4 applies, relator has exhausted his right to postconviction relief. See **State ex rel. Bonvillain v. State**, 2015-2331 (La. 3/14/16), 186 So.3d 644 (per curiam); see also **State v. Roy**, 2018-1295 (La. 1/14/19), ___ So.3d ___ (per curiam), 2019 WL 257939. Moreover, although relator attempted to raise an exception to the time delays and for filing a successive application by making a facts-not-known claim regarding trial counsel, relator failed to allege a claim that, if established would entitle him to relief. See La. Code Crim. P. art. 928.
