MEMORANDUM.

A Recorder's Court jury convicted defendant, as charged, of possession with intent to deliver less than fifty grams of cocaine, MCL 333.7401(1) and (2)(a)(iv); MSA 14.15(7401)(1) and (2)(a)(iv). Defendant was sentenced to five to twenty years' imprisonment. Defendant appeals as of right. We affirm.

Viewing the evidence in a light most favorable to the prosecutor, a rational trier of fact could find beyond a reasonable doubt that defendant intended to deliver the cocaine in light of his possession of forty-six individually packaged rocks of cocaine and his presence in a residence where a police officer had recently witnessed suspected narcotic sales. *People v Wolfe*, 440 Mich 508, 515-517, 524; 489 NW2d 748 (1992), amended 441 Mich 1201 (1992).

We affirm.
