1                   PER CURIAM

2                   Appellant seeks reversal of a judgment committing her for a period not to  
3 exceed 180 days. ORS 426.130. She contends that the state failed to prove, by clear and  
4 convincing evidence, that, because of a mental disorder, she is a danger to herself or  
5 unable to provide for her basic needs. ORS 426.005(1)(e). The state concedes that the  
6 evidence is legally insufficient to support the involuntary commitment and that the  
7 judgment should be reversed. We agree, accept the state's concession, and reverse.

8                   Reversed.
