2 Appellant seeks reversal of a judgment committing her as a mentally ill
3 person for a period not to exceed 180 days. ORS 426.130. Appellant argues that the
4 record does not establish by clear and convincing evidence that she is unable to provide
5 for her basic needs because of a mental disorder. *See* ORS 426.005(1)(e). The state
6 concedes that the evidence is legally insufficient for involuntary commitment and that the
7 judgment should be reversed. We agree, accept the state's concession, and reverse.
