2 Appellant seeks reversal of the trial court's judgment committing her as a
3 mentally ill person for a period of time not to exceed 180 days. ORS 426.130. She
4 contends that the trial court erred in concluding that she is a danger to herself as the result
5 of a mental disorder. *See* ORS 426.005(1)(e). The state concedes that the record does
6 not contain legally sufficient evidence to support the involuntary commitment and that
7 the trial court's judgment should be reversed. We agree, accept the state's concession,
8 and reverse.
