MEMORANDUM OPINION

Appellant attempts to appeal the trial court's May 29, 2018 commitment order. Because the appeal is untimely, we dismiss.

To appeal a trial court's commitment order under Article 46B.102, one must file a notice of appeal no later than the 10th day after the date the order is signed. *See* TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 574.070(b), (e). Here, however, appellant filed

her notice of appeal well past the 10-day deadline. We advised appellant that the appeal was subject to possible dismissal for lack of jurisdiction, and we asked appellant to file a response establishing that this court had jurisdiction. We received no response.

Because the notice of appeal was untimely, we lack jurisdiction. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 25.1. We dismiss the appeal. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 42.3(a). We dismiss any pending motions as moot.
