MEMORANDUM OPINION

Relator, John William Palmer, acting pro se but represented by counsel in the court below, has filed a petition for writ of mandamus.¹ In the petition, he complains of the prosecutors' "conspiracy," asserting he did not waive his right to a jury trial but, rather, the trial court, prosecutors and stand-by counsel waived his
