MEMORANDUM OPINION

On June 22, 2016, relators, Tom Thomas, Dan Sheehan, and Marc Culp, Individually and as Successors to the Interest of Thomas, Sheehan & Culp, L.L.P., filed a petition for writ of mandamus in this court. *See* Tex. Gov't Code Ann.

§ 22.221 (West 2004); *see also* Tex. R. App. P. 52. In the petition, relators ask this court to compel the Honorable Mike Wood, presiding judge of Probate Court No. 2 of Harris County, to vacate his June 7, 2016 order transferring the relators' suit for attorney's fees from the 162nd District Court in Dallas County, to Probate Court No. 2.
