**MEMORANDUM OPINION**

On February 8, 2017, relator Paul E. Nunu filed a petition for writ of mandamus in this court. *See* Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 22.221 (West 2004); *see also* Tex. R. App. P. 52. In the petition, relator asks this court to compel the Honorable Loyd H. Wright, presiding judge of the Probate Court No. 1 of Harris County, to vacate his Order Accepting Conditional Resignation of Independent Executrix, and Appointing Successor Dependent Administrator signed on January 12, 2017.

Generally, to obtain mandamus relief, a relator must show both that the trial court clearly abused its discretion and that the relator has no adequate remedy by appeal. *In re Prudential Ins. Co.*, 148 S.W.3d 124, 135–36 (Tex. 2004) (orig. proceeding).

Relator has not established that he is entitled to mandamus relief. We therefore deny relator's petition for writ of mandamus.
