MEMORANDUM OPINION

On June 5, 2017, relator Schlumberger Limited, a/k/a Schulumberger N.V. filed a petition for writ of mandamus in this court. *See* Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 22.221 (West 2004); *see also* Tex. R. App. P. 52. In the petition, relator asks this court to compel the Honorable Wesley Ward, presiding judge of the 234th District

Court of Harris County, to vacate the portion of his June 1, 2017 order denying, in part, relator's motion strike to apex witnesses from the witness list of real party in interest and motion for a protective order.

Relator subsequently filed an unopposed motion to dismiss the original proceeding because the parties have resolved the subject matter of this proceeding. Relator's requested relief in the petition for writ of mandamus is now moot. The motion is granted.

Accordingly, relator's petition for writ of mandamus is ordered dismissed. Relator's emergency motion for temporary relief is further denied as moot.
