MEMORANDUM MAJORITY OPINION

On August 9, 2022, relator Ronald Scott Catt filed a petition for writ of mandamus in this Court. *See* Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 22.221; *see also* Tex. R. App. P. 52. In the petition, relator asks this Court to compel the Honorable O'Neil Williams, presiding judge of the 268th District Court of Fort Bend County, to disqualify lawyers from the Fort Bend County Attorney's Office from representing Fort Bend County District Attorney Brian Middleton in a civil suit relator has filed against Middleton.

Relator has not established that he is entitled to mandamus relief. Accordingly, we deny relator's petition for writ of mandamus.
