DISMISSED FOR LACK OF JURISDICTION

The trial court signed a final appealable order on March 20, 2013. Appellant's notice of appeal was due to be filed on April 19, 2013. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 26.1(a). A motion for extension of time to file the notice of appeal was due on May 6, 2013. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 26.3. Appellant filed a notice of appeal and motion for extension of time on May 8, 2010.¹

¹ The post-mark on the accompanying envelope shows that the document was mailed on May 7, 2013. TEX. R. APP. P. 9.2(b)(1) (extending deadline for filing if document deposited in mail on or before the last day for filing).

“[O]nce the period for granting a motion for extension of time under Rule [26.3] has passed, a party can no longer invoke the appellate court’s jurisdiction.” *See Verburgt v. Dorner*, 959 S.W.2d 615, 617 (Tex. 1997). By order dated July 8, 2013, appellant was ordered to show cause in writing by July 23, 2013, why this appeal should not be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. Appellant did not respond to the order. Because appellant’s notice of appeal was untimely filed, this appeal is dismissed for lack of jurisdiction.
