PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS DENIED AS MOOT

On August 21, 2015, relator Robert Martinez filed a petition for writ of mandamus complaining of the trial court's failure to rule on his motion for judgment nunc pro tunc. The trial court provided this court with a copy of its Judgment Nunc Pro Tunc, signed on September 15, 2015. Accordingly, the petition for writ of mandamus is denied as moot. *See* TEX. R. APP.
