PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS DISMISSED FOR LACK OF JURISDICTION

On August 14, 2017, Relator filed a petition for writ of mandamus seeking a mandamus directed against the judge of County Court at Law Number Two of Bexar County, Texas. This court is without jurisdiction to grant the requested relief. *See Powell v. Hocker*, 516 S.W.3d 488, 494 (Tex. Crim. App. 2017) (holding intermediate courts of appeals in Texas do not have jurisdiction to issue writs of mandamus against statutory county courts). Accordingly, Relator's petition for writ of mandamus is dismissed for lack of jurisdiction.<sup>2</sup>

<sup>2</sup> The Texas State Legislature has amended the Texas Government Code to extend the mandamus jurisdiction of the intermediate courts to statutory county and statutory probate courts; however, that amendment does not take effect until September 1, 2017. *See* Act of May 28, 2017, 85th Leg., R.S., S.B. 1233 (to be codified as an amendment to Tex. Gov't. Code § 22.221).
