PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS DISMISSED FOR LACK OF JURISDICTION

Relator filed a pro se petition for writ of mandamus asking this court to compel the presiding judge of the San Antonio Municipal Court to rule on his pending Motion for Credit Time Served.

This court's mandamus jurisdiction is limited to writs against a district court judge or county court judge in our district and all writs necessary to enforce our jurisdiction. TEX. GOV'T CODE § 22.221(a), (b). We do not have authority to issue writs of mandamus against a municipal court judge unless it is necessary to enforce our jurisdiction. *In re Chang*, 176 S.W.3d 451, 452 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 2004, orig. proceeding) (per curiam); *see also Thompson v. Velasquez*, 155 S.W.3d 551, 554 (Tex. App.—San Antonio 2004, no pet.) (holding district courts have general mandamus jurisdiction over municipal courts).
