## DISMISSED FOR LACK OF JURISDICTION

Appellant Montrail Butler seeks to appeal the trial court's order dismissing the charges against him. An order dismissing charges is not an order a defendant may appeal. *Bohannan v. State*, 353 S.W.3d 47, 48 (Tex. App.—Fort Worth 2011, pet. ref'd); *accord Crider v. State*, No. 04-19-00512-CR, 2019 WL 4647705, \*1 (Tex. App.—San Antonio Sept. 25, 2019, no pet.) (per curiam) (mem. op.). On June 19, 2020, this court ordered appellant to show cause in writing why

this appeal should not be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. Appellant did not respond to the order. Accordingly, we dismiss this appeal for lack of jurisdiction. *See Bohannan*, 353 S.W.3d at 48.
