## **MEMORANDUM OPINION**

Relator Thomas Wayne Parker filed a *pro se* petition for writ of mandamus, in which he alleges that the trial court has refused to rule on his motion to award him the proper amount of pre-sentence jail-time credits. Parker has not demonstrated that he is clearly entitled to mandamus relief from this Court. *See State ex rel. Hill v. Court of Appeals for Fifth Dist.*, 34 S.W.3d 924, 927 (Tex. Crim. App. 2001) (holding that to establish entitlement to a writ of mandamus, a relator must establish that the trial court failed to perform a ministerial duty and that relator has no other adequate legal remedy). Accordingly, we deny relief on the petition for writ of mandamus.
