MEMORANDUM OPINION

Before QUINN, C.J., and PARKER and DOSS, JJ.

Appellant, Nobel Leaf Holdings, LLC, appeals from the trial court's *Amended Order Granting Application for Temporary Injunction*. Now pending before this Court is Appellant's unopposed motion seeking voluntary dismissal of the appeal. The Court finds that the motion to dismiss complies with the requirements of Rule of Appellate Procedure 42.1(a)(1) and that granting the motion will not prevent any party from seeking relief to which it would otherwise be entitled. As no decision of the Court has been delivered to date, we grant the motion. The appeal is dismissed. Because the motion does not reflect

an agreement of the parties concerning the payment of costs, costs will be taxed against Appellant. See Tex. R. App. P. 42.1(d). We direct the district clerk to release Appellant's cash bond to Appellant. No motion for rehearing will be entertained and our mandate will issue forthwith.
