*MEMORANDUM OPINION
PER CURIAM*

On September 25, 2013, Relator, Elizabeth Thurman, filed a petition for writ of habeas corpus in which she alleges that she is being unlawfully confined in the Cherokee County Jail pursuant to a void contempt order. Based upon the grounds stated in her petition, she seeks to be released from custody.

In an original habeas proceeding, the relator has the burden to provide this court with a record sufficient to establish her right to habeas corpus relief. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 52.3(k)(1), 52.7(a); *Walker v. Packer*, 827 S.W.2d 833, 837 (Tex. 1992) (orig. proceeding). Here, however, Thurman has failed to provide us with a record that is sufficient to support her claims.¹ Accordingly, we *deny* the petition for writ of habeas corpus.
