The sole issue presented by this appeal is whether the evidence is sufficient to sustain appellant's bench trial conviction for concealment of goods valued at \$200 or more, in violation of Code § 18.2-103. We note that appellant has failed to comply with Rule 5A:20; however, we have examined the record and find that the evidence is sufficient to support the conviction. See Cephas v. Commonwealth, 211 Va. 726, 180 S.E.2d 345 (1971).

Accordingly, the judgment of the trial court is affirmed.
