American Red Cross and its insurer (hereinafter referred to as "employer") appeal a decision of the Workers' Compensation Commission finding that Tracey L. Trent proved she sustained an injury by accident arising out of and in the course of her employment on September 24, 2005. We have reviewed the record and the commission's opinion and find that this appeal is without merit. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the commission in its final opinion. See Trent v.
